Goals

Code	Goal
C1	The aim of the course is to familiarise students with the concept of linguistic landscape (LL) and show its significance in the creation of public semiotic/symbolic space. Except for general theoretical introduction, which aims at explanation of basic terms, methodology of studying LL, and its interdisciplinary character, the students will conduct their own basic analysis of the linguistic landscape in various social contexts. The course will focus on different semiotic spaces, e.g. schools, offices or public urban space. During the course students will learn what is the role of LL in creating identities of ethno-linguistic groups, preservation of culture and cultural heritage. The workshops will also explore how globalisation and social practices and processes related to it may be reflected in LL.
