## Goals

Code	Goal
C1	The learning objectives of the course is to make the student acquire necessary skills and competence to apply effective and efficient strategies in making unaided and unassisted searches within diverse information environments to obtain specific information, in particular using the aggregate of the AMU library and information system. Another learning objective is to make students aware of their own information needs within the context of the curricula on offer and to master the appropriate skills and techniques for searching essential and necessary information in the resources of AMU libraries, and to upgrade their abilities to select and determine necessary information and critical evaluation of its sources leading to efficient and effective use of the AMU library and information system. Yet another learning objective is to get students aware of all available information sources, including those utilising state-of-the-art reference management tools useful in compiling reference lists and bibliographies, and to teach students how to create bibliographies for their bachelor's degrees (BA theses).
