Goals

Code	Goal

They choose the material for their own study and the method of data collection. They further develop their knowledge and skills about carrying out empirical linguistic research and presenting it in spoken and written form. They design their research plan. Depending on the chosen topic, they may complete one of the following tasks: writing up the theoretical background, carrying out a pilot study, designing a questionnaire, collecting samples of spoken or written language.
